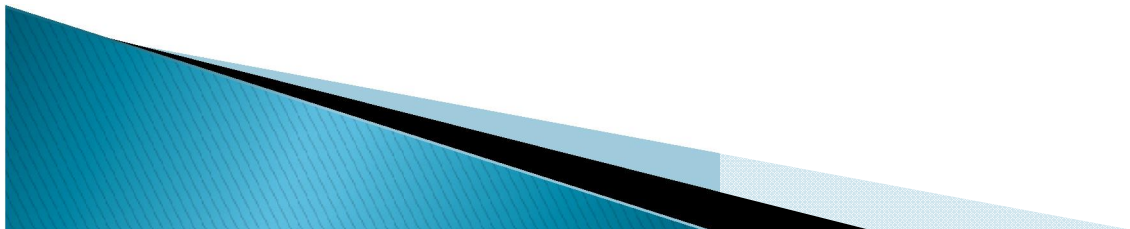
RECENT ACTIVITIES (2015)

- ▶ Master scholarship in G-CIO:
UI (UN-APCICT modules) 30 students
UGM 30 students
ITB 30 students
ITS 25 students
- ▶ Short-term training in G-CIO:
500 participants in 10 provincial capital cities, incl. in one city to roll-out UN-APCICT module on Information Security and Privacy (Batam, 18-22 May 2015)
- ▶ MCIT and KOICA training program in e-Government, especially in G-CIO:
100 participants (of 1.500 to finish in 2016)



FUTURE PLAN (2016)

- ▶ Master scholarship in G-CIO for 120 government officers
- ▶ Short-term training in G-CIO for 400 government officers
- ▶ MCIT and KOICA training program in e-Government for the rest of 1.400 government officers, including those from Timor Leste
- ▶ Developing standard of competency and certification system of G-CIO and of government positions related with IT utilization (implementation of Act No. 9/2015 on Local Government)



RECENT CHANGES IN ICT LANDSCAPE

- ▶ Palapa Ring Project is still on going to reach Eastern parts of the country;
- ▶ ICT industry start promoting 4G and 5G services;
- ▶ More central and local government institutions utilize social media to support their communication and delivery of services;
- ▶ Many of local government institutions are now getting interested to develop smart cities by investing and spending more budget on IT services.
